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Study of Nosodes with Special Emphasis on Carcinosin

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ABSTRACT:

It is very useful to make a comparative study of the symptoms of a group of plants, minerals, animals and nosodes. Symptoms of the group of nosodes are an indication to study the case from a miasmic point of view. From a study of all available symptoms, one can discover which miasma is active or which nosode vital force is attracting attention. At such a time, intercurrent can be useful to remove obstacles to treatment or to get a clearer picture. All miasmic intercurrents should be supplemented at the appropriate time with constitutional remedies to complete the treatment.

The following are some of the more characteristic rubrics connected with the use of the nosode group as an intercurrent remedy; When well-chosen medicines do not work, they stop or only change the symptoms; When progress according to the institutional remedy stops due to a miasmic obstacle in the treatment; "Syndrome never well", when it can be observed as a chronic miasma; Lack of symptoms causes miasmata.

The characteristics of the group of nosodes are a signal to explore the chronic miasmata and chart their signs and symptoms, as well as to search in detail for the symptoms of the main nosodes and antimiasmic remedies. There are always objective symptoms and objective symptoms that will individualize the remedy if it is indicated. Over the years, the use of nosodes as intercurrents has proven to be a useful adjunct to constitutional treatment when properly used.

The isopathic concept is so easy (use like for like) that many star beginners think they've found a shortcut to doing homeopathy. They do not have enough experience with constitutional homeopathy to understand those special moments when intercurrents supplement constitutional treatment. Others are prone to fall into the old allopathic thinking combined with the new homeopathic remedies. This leads to the abuse of idem power and the violation of the constitutional state. In the name of treating layers or removing drugs and blockages, half-hearted homeopaths give more and more drugs and look less and less at symptoms.

Nosodes in general have a checkered history in homeopathy. Some more pathological prescribers [e.g. Hughes & Dudgeon] condemned them from the start. Other homeopaths, however, took a much more generous view: "the indispensable curative service of the products of disease...safely administered in disease"; In particular, nosodes can be used to neutralize old internalized disease states [dyscrasias] or to remove invisible "defects" [blockages] that prevent the effect of ordinary medicines: "the nosode removed the miasmatic block."] Then "the medicine will work again. after removing the block with a nosode." That, at least, is the empirical observation of many who use them in routine clinical practice: nosodes have not been as well established as "the known polychrests...but they have been as successful." Their use "depends rather on clinical experience...[which] has been accumulated over many years and has been verified by the experience of so many practitioners that it is considered trustworthy."

Introduction:

When a nosode is applied by the sum of symptoms, it is a constitutional simillimum as well as mineral, vegetable and animal remedies. Nosodes are their own genus of primitive miasmata, which are the first life forms on our planets and are symbiotically related to the development of the first plant algae. Viruses, bacteria and fungi are ancient groups of genera and some cause disease in humans. Minerals are the first drugs in the developmental chain, followed by miasmata, fungi, lichens, ferns, ferns, gymnosperms, dicots and monocots, and finally animal drugs. The nosode genus group is very special in classical homeopathy.

Hahnemann wanted the nosodes to be fully proven before they were entered into the materia medica. He was quite concerned that homeopathy was being mixed with isopathy, which provides remedies only on the basis of causation. Swam, who is credited with introducing our Medorrhinum and Syphilinum, was asked whether it was right to use unauthenticated nosodes. He replied that 100 years of suffering from these hereditary diseases and their complications was "natural evidence".

There is some justification for this somewhat controversial answer. However, it is clear that the most characteristic indications of nosodes are those that came out in the proving. However, there are special ways in which the miasmata morbidly tune out the vital force producing a characteristic set of symptoms. Hering noticed that certain characteristic symptoms are associated with indications of miasmic intercurrents. Just as the homeopath working with drug families recognizes the nature of the group of plants, the group of minerals, and the group of animals, Hering also recognized the characteristic

of the group image of the nosodes. These characteristics include indications of miasmata accompanied by a lack of vital response to well-chosen drugs, constant alternation of symptoms, fragmented images of institutional drugs, and unilateral miasmatic symptoms with few characteristic symptoms.

Such individuals often feel that they are tainted, guilty, dirty, or feel that life is a burden, never feel comfortable or satisfied in any environment, have pale skin and a distressed look on their face when relaxed, and are prone to self-destructive behavior. impulses, tastes and habits. A differential analysis of other mental and general symptoms will immediately reveal which chronic miasma and therapeutic nosode are at the root of the picture.

Review of Literature:

NOSODIES

Homeopathic preparations from purulent microbial culture obtained from diseased tissue and clinical materials (secretions, discharges, etc.) are known as nosodes.

Nozoda is a homeopathic medicine prepared from a pathological specimen. Nosode from the Greek word "nosos" meaning sick. The Greek word Noso is a prefix added to the idea of disease denoting its morbid root. The term is also associated with the Latin word "noxa", the root of noxious or damaged. This means using potentially dangerous harmful materials as the basis for a potentized medicine. A sample is taken from a sick animal or person and may consist of saliva, pus, urine, blood or diseased tissue. Substances such as respiratory secretions or diseased tissues are used. preparation with alcohol, as well as repeated dilutions and suctions, essentially renders the substances harmless while creating a potent medicine. The use of nosodes in a prophylactic way to prevent disease has been used in veterinary and human homeopathy for many years.

The practice of isopathic medicines started a new controversy in homeopathy. Dr. Hering called them absolutely homeopathic, while Dr. Lux considered them to be independent isopathic. Dr. Hering said that because these drugs are extracted from similar situations (disease syndrome, analogous organs) and then given to patients who suffer from similar diseases, it is a "similimum". According to Dr. Hering was no deviation from homeopathy, but Dr. Lux believed that because the same disease product is administered to the same disease patient or under the same conditions, it is "idm." Other doctors also formed their opinions, either in favor of "similim" or "idm".

Dr. Samuel Hahnemann gave this method some credit until the fifth edition of the Organon, but in the sixth edition he condemned the method. Hahnemann objects to "...his so-called method of curing by identical and idm, which he calls IsopathyWithout knowing how they can do it in practice", and again writes that Isopathy is not the solution to any disease. Dr. Hahnemann believes that "the fourth way of using medicines in disease he tried to call by means of isopathy, as it is called, that is, the method of curing a given disease by the same infectious principle that causes it. nevertheless, when we see that the miasma is given to the patient highly dynamized, and therefore to some extent in an altered state, the cure is effected only by the opposite of similim to similim". He continues again: "Isopathic and continuation are erroneous expressions which, if they express anything, can only mean similimum, for they are certainly not idm.

In the sixth edition of the Organon, Hahnemann vehemently opposed the doctrine of idm, concluding that if any morbid element of the human being is given to any other person, nothing but trouble and aggravation of the disease can result.

Throughout the history of Dr. Collect assumed that a remedy made from such a type of pathological substance as described earlier is a perfect simile, so that it is complete homeopathy. He thought: "If the true medicine should be more like the cause of the disease than the cause of the disease, nothing is more like the cause of the disease than the cause of the disease itself." Dr. Collect freely used pathological secretions as catarrhal organ problems. He also used any secretion from the human body that caused disease. He opined that sometimes isopathic medicines (which are homoeopathic in nature) open a case for those medicines whose drug stock is not from isopathic stock. In this way he adopted the second branch of homeopathic medicine.

At the same time. Dr. Dano considered Isopathy the perfect "similimum". He held that a person supplying a supply of such a type of medicine provides a perfect "similimum" because that similimum is a perfect image for that person, and after the proper potency, when administered to the patient in question, becomes a perfect similimum.

We see that so many physicians and philosophers have been associated with the philosophy and action of isopathy, but the name of Dr. Herring, Dr. Lux and Dr. Collect are held in high regard for their work and contribution to the science of isopathy, although it is surprising that Dr. Herring and Dr. Collect took Isopathy as the perfect "similimum", but Dr. Lux adopted Isopathy as "idm".

IMPORTANT FINDINGS

There are several very important points from the above descriptions. Isopathy emerged in the medical science of homeopathy:-

- 1. Pathological secretions or diseased tissues have been obtained from humans.
- 2. Something that drug supplies also come from the animal kingdom.
- 3. A stock of drugs for both infectious and non-infectious diseases is used as medicine.
- 4. Extract from healthy human organs was also used as medicine.
- 5. Medicines stimulate the whole organ from which they were extracted, or the pathological secretions stir up and strengthen the organ from which they were secreted.

- 6. All these substances were potentized on the principles of the homeopathic pharmacopoeia.
- 7. Sometimes these drugs were given to the same patient who supplied the drug supplies, and sometimes they were given to a different person.
- 8. The controversy over isopathy being true homeopathy is a matter of debate in pockets of homeopathy. However, the father of homeopathy rejected its homeopathic nature.
- 9. The medicine obtained in this way provides good immunity against infectious diseases, but it can also be helpful for non-infectious diseases.
- 10. Medicines obtained in this way cure the same disease from which they were obtained.

Dr. Burnet, Dr. Sevan, Dr. Hergo, Dr. Keigel and Dr. Clarke are one of those renowned names who have made medicines using this method and certainly made an invaluable contribution to homeopathy.

Isopathic treatment paved the way for Nosods, Sarcodes and Organotherapy in the future. We will deal with this elsewhere in this work. But the findings and method of Isopathy remains the mother of Nosodes, it can never prove wrong.

NOSODIES IN HOMEOPATHY

Hahnemann made the first proof of a nosode, namely the nosode of Psora, called Psorinum. The symptoms produced are strongly marked and characteristic, and Psorinum is one of the most trusted agents in the materia medica, answering curatively in every case where its main features are prominent.

It has been argued that it is not homeopathy-treatment by "likes" - but isopathy-treatment by "identicals". Hahnemann met this objection by showing that the homeopathically prepared nosoda was not identical with the original virus, but merely liked it, the process of preparation having altered it. "I call Psorinum," he says, "the homeopathic antipsoric, because unless Psorinum changed its nature into that of a homeopathic medicine, it could never have any effect on an organism attacked by the same identical virus. The psoriasis virus, by undergoing the processes of trituration and shaking, changes its nature just as gold, whose homoeopathic preparations are not inert substances in the animal economy, but powerful substances."

- 2. Because nosodes are drugs that are obtained from microbial cultures according to pathological standards, they become specific to the condition from which they are derived.
- 3. Nosodes start the cycle of self-immunity. Because nosodes are a pattern of the kinetic energy of any miasma, they create their own immunity against that particular miasmatic susceptibility.
- 4. Nosodes stimulate and revitalize individual system actions. They also strengthen individual organs. They also nourish the entire constitutional

miasmatic make-up, so that if given at the right time, they act both in harmony with homeopathy and specifically.

- 5. As we know that the nosodes are a model of the kinetic energy of the original miasmatic imbalance, the use of the nosodes first provides a perfect comparison to the original condition of the human soil. Second, it decides the line of action of the case and unlocks the mystery of any miasmatic obstruction.
- Speed of recovery is another advantage of nosodes.
- The nosodes reach the very constitutional dyscrasia where our well-chosen similimum and antimiasmatic remedies fail to achieve the quality of deep penetration, will add another feather to the nosodes' victorious cap.

It is a proven fact that the law of analogy, minimum dose, monopharmacy, potentiation, the concept of miasmatic features and vital force reactions constitute the necessity of homeopathy and every homeopath would like to try his nosode only according to the above instructions. A real homeopath always moves on the line of action - "treat the patient and not the disease". The best use of the nosode undoubtedly depends on the above principle.

Already in 1980, the great Dr. Schmidt. marked the rubric as the highest grade; "Easily offended, takes everything the wrong way" in Barthel Klunker's synthetic repertoire, published by Haug Verlag Heidelberg.

In my experience, the most obvious symptom has been an aggravating craving for any of the foods.

The strangest aspect is the presence of a biphasic character; desire and aversion or aggravation and improvement in the same rubric.

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
