When asked about the transformation in social life 98.67 per cent said they were now more interested and attracted towards group activities. The NSS volunteers are now more voluntary in doing social activities, 92.25 per cent agreed to this. In the case of social responsibility 91.92 per cent said there is change in social responsibility. The volunteers were of the opinion that their social acceptance has increased and 77.67 per cent agreed to this statement. When asked about the involvement of volunteers in social issues creatively 72.42 per cent said they were actively involved now in social issues.

Communication

Communication Skills simply means the ability to convey or share ideas and feelings effectively and efficiently. This is very important for both verbal and written. The programmes and activities in NSS should normally help volunteers to develop this skill. This ability is assessed for both NSS volunteers and Non-NSS students.

From the table 2. It can be seen that 10.43 per cent of total sample of students strongly agree that they are able to write reports of the programmes organized in their college due to the exposure they have in NSS and 36.06 agree with it. The percentage of those who strongly disagree with the statement is 4.84 per cent and 24.92 per cent disagrees with this statement. It can also be seen that 23.75 per cent neither agree nor disagree with statement. The mean opinion score of total sample is calculated to be 3.22 which is significantly higher than the mean of the response scale as the significance level of one-sample t-test is less than 0.05. The mean score of NSS volunteers was found to be 3.75. These scores are significantly different from the mean of the response scale as the significance levels are less than 0.05. From the result it can be inferred that generally, NSS volunteers are able to write reports of the programmes organized which show their ability in written communication.
